Notes: The State Entrepreneurship Index is based on 2013 data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the IRS Statistics of Income Bulletin, the U.S. Census Bureau and the U.S. Statistical Abstract. A state index for each of five key components derived from the data – percentage growth and per capita growth in business establishments, business formation rate, patents per thousand residents and average non-farm proprietor income — is assigned based on how much each state's performance is above or below the median of all state data, which has a value of 1.0. For example, a component one standard deviation above the median is assigned a value of 2.0, while a component one below is assigned a value of zero. A state's overall SEI number is the average of the five index values.

Year-to-year ranking changes are based on the difference between each state's spot in the current rankings and their final ranks in the revised 2012 SEI rankings. Some states' positions in the original 2012 rankings changed after final 2012 data were added.
